

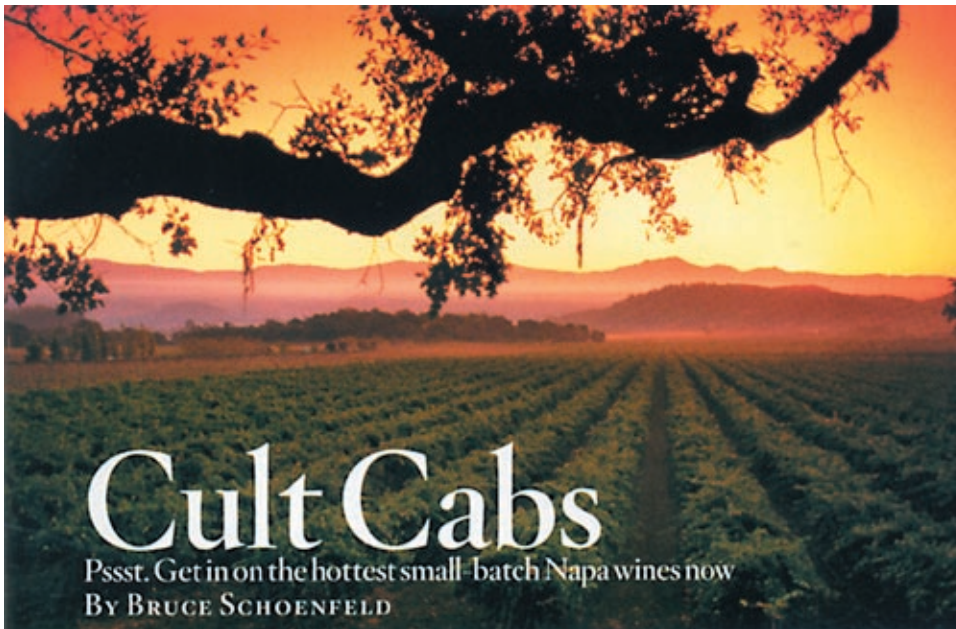

Each year, Napa Valley winemakers turn out Cabernet Sauvignons and Cab-based blends that are almost impossible to find. Top wines from Bryant Family, Harlan Estate, Screaming Eagle, and others cost \$150 and up per bottle. The fortunate few allowed to buy these cult favorites are high-end restaurants and longtime customers, who fill oversubscribed mailing lists. One Hollywood producer even christened his daughter Maya, the name of a wine from Dalla Valle Vineyards, hoping to get his allotment increased. (It wasn't.)

A new generation of small-batch winemakers has emerged, and their wines are sure to garner the same exclusivity. Our advice: Get them now, before it's too late.

Cliff Lede After he bought the old S. Anderson property off Silverado Trail, Canadian businessman Cliff Lede generated buzz when he installed artwork by Keith Haring and Jim Dine and named vineyard parcels after rock songs like "Cinnamon Girl" and "Sympathy for the Devil." But it's his wine that's creating excitement today, especially the 2001 Poetry (\$100), the first vintage of what will undoubtedly become a legendary Napa Cabernet. 800-428-2259, cliffledevineyards.com
